REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Board of School Directors and Citizens of the Town of Clarendon:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Good schools don't just happen. They develop through the active cooperation of the school staff, and parents and friends in the community. The part played by enlightened citizens in their support of public schools will continue to pay dividends through the turning out of young people better equipped to face the future.

THE 3 R's

Schools are not the same as they were in the "good old days". DEFINITELY NOT. They have improved.

In the old days, the elementary schools would prepare students for high school, and the high schools would then prepare students for college. That was the main purpose of education, and naturally the "drop-out" rate was high.

Today, most of our young people are staying in school until they complete prescribed courses in education. As children differ in ability, in health, and in interest, so must the schools adjust their work to fit individual needs. All the pedagogical skill in the world cannot make perfect spellers and readers out of every child in our public school system. Education cannot compensate for either mental or physical defects, but it can aid and assist every child. With our compulsory school attendance laws, and as children spend more time in school, certainly the 3 R's must not be neglected.

SCHOOL ENROLLMENTS

Our entrance regulation requires that a child be six years old before January 1 to enter Grade 1 in September of that school year.

A great deal of thinking has gone into this matter of school entrance by various educators throughout our country. It is important to parents in the future success of their children that boys and girls be fairly close to six years old before they try the reading program as presented in our schools in the first grade. We can give your children a much better foundation in reading, which will eliminate failure in later grades, if your children are a little older when they enter school.

- 9. To see if the Town will appropriate \$200.00 to be used in cooperation with State and Federal Funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the Town.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to pay more than \$175.00 tuition for High School students.
- 11. Shall the Town give the Library Association \$25.00 for upkeep?
- 12. Shall the Town authorize the Selectmen to buy a power grader?
- 13. To see what tax said Town will vote to pay the expenses of the Town Schools.
- 14. To see what tax said Town will vote to pay current expenses of said Town for the ensuing year, and to pay the indebtedness of said Town.
- 15. To see if the Town will pay the Taxes to the Town Treasurer.
- 16. Shall licenses for the sale of malt and vinous beverages be granted in this Town?
- 17. Shall spirituous liquors be sold in this Town?
