SELECTMEN'S REPORT

To give the voters of the town an opportunity to meet with the selectmen, open meetings have been held on a regular basis at 8 p.m. on the second Monday of each month at the Town Clerk's office.

Interim zoning expired September 18th. The selectmen interpreted the sentiments of the voters as wanting a simple ordinance which would afford some control. This was done and a Board of Construction was appointed consisting of the Board of Selectmen, the Health Officer and two appointees.

New equipment purchased was a sander and snow plow. For the purpose of saving 7 cents per gallon on gasoline we have acquired a storage tank which is a prerequisite to purchasing through the State purchasing agent.

The Clarendon Cemeteries have not been maintained in a satisfactory condition for some time and we have no intention of permitting this condition to continue. We feel that a Cemetery Association should be formed by some of the most interested citizens. We will appreciate advice and assistance to this end. Thus far we have assurance of the assistance of the Clarendon Volunteer Fire Dept. and we expect several other people will assist.

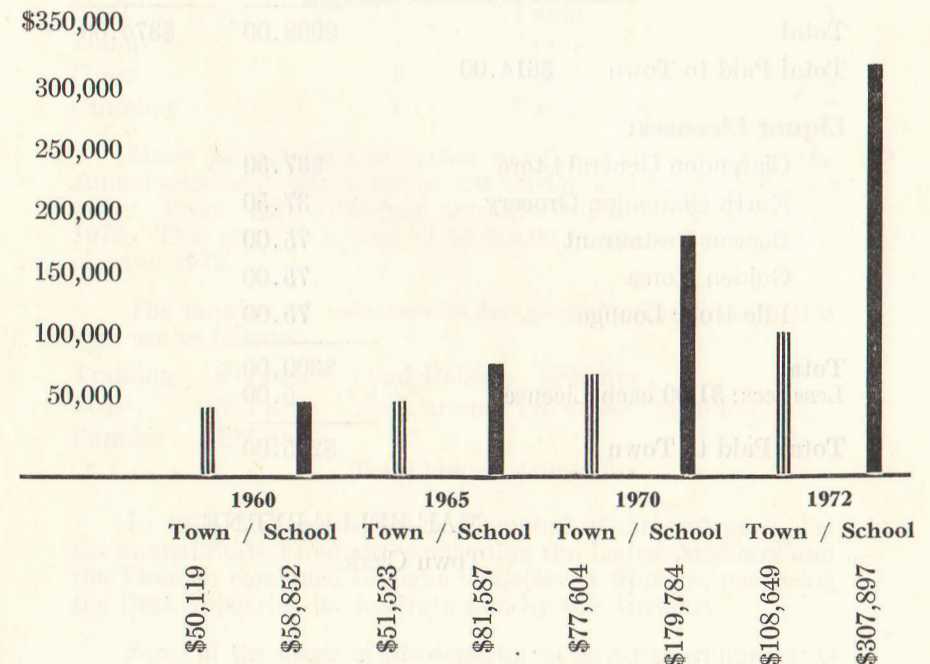

THE CLARENDON FIRE ASSOCIATION, INC.

The Clarendon Vol. Fire Dept. has completed another successful year.

Perhaps our biggest achievement was to pay our \$1,500.00 note on our tank truck. We are now setting money aside for a new pumper. We have \$1,700.00 set aside at this time.

In the past year we received twenty fire calls and of these twenty calls four were for Mutual Aid from nearby towns. A total of 565 man hours were given for fighting these fires. The breakdown is as follows:

Many fund raising activities were carried on such as the annual auction, suppers, raffles, car washes and fire extinguisher sales. From these volunteer activities we raised \$3,085.00 in 1972. This gave us a total of \$5,585.00 to operate our department in 1972.

In 1972 the department participated in three parades. At the annual State Firemans Convention the Ladies Auxiliary and the Firemen combined brought home seven trophies, one being the Best Appearing in the State won by the Auxiliary.

Some of the needs of the department as far as equipment is concerned are a new pumper, another portable pump, additional hose, an electric generator and a smoke ejector. We realize that this all will take time and possibly years to purchase, but with

the generous help of our Townspeople, our Firemen and Ladies Auxiliary working together we will achieve our goals.

We wish to thank each and everyone for your generosity in the past and the support you have given us. We would also like to thank the school board for giving us the use of the school and premises for our Regional Fire Schools. This school was well attended by firemen from throughout the State and some from New York State.

It is because of this public interest that we have the active and interested department we do today, and it insures the protection you now have and in the future.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL DIRECTORS AND THE SUPERINTENDENT

Enrollment at the elementary school continues to increase and the number of Clarendon pupils attending high school is greater each year. The result of these increases is reflected in the cost of operation of the school program.

If the number of elementary pupils continues at the same rate in the next few years, it will require more space at the elementary school. Clarendon taxpayers should be aware of this possibility.

Enrollment figures are as follows:

January 4, 1971	— 280
January 3, 1972	— 303
January 2, 1973	— 332

More teachers and materials are required for these additional pupils each year resulting in more cost to operate the school program.

Tuition pupils attending high school during the present year are as follows:

Fourteen of this number will graduate in June. However, the eighth grade numbers 38 so the net increase will be twenty-four more tuition pupils. The total budgeted for tuition payments for secondary-school pupils is \$155,000.

Transportation of your children has been discussed at several school directors meetings during this year. In an effort to meet some of the problems, it is the intention of the School District to add a third bus next fall. This will increase the budget for this item.

The total budget for the next fiscal year totals \$404,533.75 which represents an increase of \$56,306.00 over last year. State Aid continues to increase as follows:

Accordingly the sum of money needed in local taxes for the next fiscal year is \$245,000.

It is most encouraging to note the progress being made in the development of a strong program of education by the excellent staff at the elementary school under the leadership of the Principal, Mr. Lewis. Clarendon is fortunate in the devotion and concern shown by our teachers and Principal.

- Article 8. Motion made and seconded to have this article stand on previous years vote, which was yes.
- Article 10. Warning read: Shall the Town vote the sum of \$105,250.00 Dollars for the General Budget for the ensuing year, in place of a Tax Rate on the revised Grand List. (Australian Ballot).

After some discussion as to the amount of the Town's share and State Aid to be received, Mr. Wm. Weeks made a motion to amend the article to read \$80,000.
