President Donald Trump Legal Team Press Conference Regarding Evidence of Election Fraud

Statements by Rudy Giuliani, Sidney Powell, and Jenna Ellis

November 19, 2020

- 1 RUDY GIULIANI: Good afternoon and thank you very much
- 2 for coming. This is representative of our legal team.
- 3 We're representing Trump and we're representing the
- 4 Trump campaign. When I finish, Sidney Powell and then
- 5 Jenna Ellis will follow me and we will present, in
- 6 brief, the evidence that we've collected over the
- 7 last -- I guess it is two weeks. Also, Joseph DiGenova
- 8 and Victoria Toensing are here with me. There are a lot
- 9 more lawyers working on this, but I guess we're the
- 10 senior lawyers, and Boris Epshteyn.
- 11 So, I guess the best way to describe this is when
- 12 we began our representation of the President, we
- 13 certainly were confirmed with a very anomalous set of
- 14 results with the President way ahead on election night,
- 15 700,000 or 800,000 in Pennsylvania. Somehow, we lost
- 16 Pennsylvania. We have statisticians willing to testify
- 17 that that's almost statistically impossible to have
- 18 happened in the period of time that it happened. But,
- 19 of course, that's just speculation. As we started
- 20 investigating, both our investigations and the very
- 21 patriotic and brave American citizens that have come
- 22 forward are extraordinary. An extraordinary number of
- 23 people -- extraordinary number of witnesses. And what
- 24 emerged very quickly is -- is it's not a singular voter
- 25 fraud in one state. This pattern repeats itself in a

- 1 number of states -- almost exactly the same pattern
- 2 which, to any experienced investigator or prosecutor
- 3 would suggest that there was a plan from a centralized
- 4 place to execute these various acts of the voter fraud,
- 5 specifically focused on big cities and specifically
- 6 focused on -- as you would imagine -- big cities
- 7 controlled by Democrats, and specifically focused on
- 8 big cities that have a long history of corruption.
- 9 The number of voter fraud causes in Philadelphia
- 10 could fill a library. Just a few weeks ago there was a
- 11 conviction for voter fraud and one two weeks before
- 12 that. And I've often said, I guess sarcastically, but
- 13 it's true -- the only surprise I would have found in
- 14 this was if Philadelphia hadn't cheated in this
- 15 election, because for the last 60 years, they've
- 16 cheated in just about every single election.
- 17 You could say the same thing about Detroit. Each
- 18 one of these cities are cities that are controlled by
- 19 Democrats. Which means that they can get away with
- 20 anything they want to do. It means they have a certain
- 21 degree of control over -- certainly control the
- 22 Election Board completely and they control law
- 23 enforcement. And unfortunately, they have some
- 24 friendly judges that will issue ridiculously irrational
- 25 opinions just to come out in their favor.

- 1 So, let's start with the specifics. Pennsylvania:
- 2 In Pennsylvania, the margin of victory now for Biden,
- 3 which is a -- not a victory -- it's fraud -- is 69,140
- 4 votes. The reality is that we are now at a count of
- 5 618,770 ballots, for which have we have affidavits that
- 6 there was no inspection of that ballot at the time that
- 7 it was entered in the vote.
- 8 If it was a mail ballot -- mail ballots are
- 9 particularly prone to fraud -- we were warned about
- 10 that by Jimmy Carter -- President Jimmy Carter and
- 11 Secretary Baker, in a report about a dozen years ago,
- 12 in which they said that mail balloting is particularly
- 13 susceptible of fraud, that we should very carefully
- 14 consider ever doing it, and that it can be taken
- 15 advantage of. Justice Souter warned us of the same
- 16 thing, in a comment in an election law case. And even
- 17 the New York Times wrote articles about how dangerous
- 18 mail-in voting was. And this is the first time we ever
- 19 did it en masse and I think we proved that all three
- 20 are prophets.
- 21 It's not only susceptible to fraud, it is easily
- 22 susceptible to fraud, particularly if you have a plan
- 23 or scheme which sounds eerily similar to what Joe Biden
- 24 told us before the election -- that he had the best
- 25 voter fraud team in the world. Well, they were good.

- 1 I don't know that they were that good because they made
- 2 significant mistakes, like all crooks do, and we caught
- 3 them. One of them was pushing out Republican
- 4 inspectors.
- 5 Every state -- almost every civilized
- 6 country -- even Tanzania and places where you wouldn't
- 7 think of, have rules about inspectors, particularly for
- 8 the mail-in ballots. And why particularly for mail-in
- 9 ballots? Because they can more easily be defrauded,
- 10 and you can't check on it.
- 11 People who have never done a mail-in ballot, I'm
- 12 going to show you why it's so easy. Well, you fill out
- 13 an envelope like this. You put your -- usually in New
- 14 York it would be your assembly district and the
- 15 precinct in which you're voting. You fill out your
- 16 name and address and you sign it. You then use an
- 17 inner envelope and you put the ballot inside the inner
- 18 envelope. You seal it off and you send it in. When
- 19 it's being counted, almost invariably in the in United
- 20 States, up until the mass cheating that went on in this
- 21 election, a Republican and a Democrat inspector, as
- 22 well as others if there are other parties, is allowed
- 23 to watch the unsealing of this ballot. Used to go on
- 24 all over America when we conducted honest elections
- 25 because the only time you can ever find out if it's a

- 1 fraudulent ballot is when it is looked at. The minute
- 2 you approve this, you just throw it away -- gone for
- 3 eternity -- the only thing left is the vote. That
- 4 could have been Micky Mouse. That could have been a
- 5 dead person. That could have been not filled out
- 6 properly. That could have been the same person 30
- 7 times. All these things have happened, by the way. That
- 8 could have been nothing filled out. We'd never know.
- 9 So, for example, the recount being done in Georgia
- 10 will tell us nothing because these fraudulent ballots
- 11 will just be counted again, because they wouldn't
- 12 supply the signatures to match the ballots. So, it
- 13 means nothing to have counted these ballots because,
- 14 for example, in Pennsylvania, where we have probably
- our most precise evidence, 682,770 of these ballots
- 16 were cast, put in and they weren't inspected, which
- 17 renders them marked. They weren't inspected, which
- 18 renders them ballots that are null and void -- cannot
- 19 be counted, have to be removed from the vote. Why? For
- 20 several reasons, not the least of which is, that was
- 21 basically only one of two places in the state where it
- 22 was done. So, in the other parts of the state there
- 23 was a legitimate inspection of the ballots. So, if you
- 24 have two different standards in different parts of the
- 25 state -- one favoring one part of the state, the other

- 1 disfavoring the other part of the state, that's classic
- 2 violation of the Equal Protection Clause of the United
- 3 States Constitution, Bush v. Gore being the most recent
- 4 case that teaches that.
- 5 That's not the only fraud that went on in
- 6 Pennsylvania. All of the other frauds carried out in
- 7 the other states by the Democrat bosses happened there
- 8 as well. For example, if you made a mistake in that
- 9 ballot and you lived in Philadelphia or in Pittsburgh,
- 10 you were allowed to fix the mistake. But if you lived
- 11 in the -- what would be considered more
- 12 Republican -- more Trump part of the state -- you were
- 13 given no such right.
- One of our plaintiffs, Mr. Henry, cast an absentee
- 15 ballot and he failed to put it in the secure envelope
- 16 inside -- just put it in open, naked. That ballot was
- 17 cast aside because it was invalid, because that breaks
- 18 the privacy of the vote. In Pittsburgh and in
- 19 Philadelphia, if they noticed that there wasn't an
- 20 inner envelope, they'd contact the voter and allow them
- 21 to vote again or if he didn't fill it out completely,
- 22 or if he made a mistake and didn't sign his full name,
- 23 he was allowed to cure it. There is no such provision
- 24 under the law in Pennsylvania the Democrat Secretary of
- 25 State made that up in order to maximize the votes in

- 1 Philadelphia and Pittsburgh and to minimize the votes
- 2 in the other parts of the state. Clearly illegal,
- 3 clearly voter fraud, easily provable, hundreds of
- 4 witnesses, maybe thousands.
- 5 We have -- to give you another example -- we have
- 6 17,000 provisional ballots cast in Pittsburgh. Do you
- 7 know what a provisional ballot is? A provisional
- 8 ballot usually happens this way -- about 15,000 of the
- 9 17,000 happened this way. You walk in and say, "I'm
- 10 here to vote today."

12 "Oh, Mr. Giuliani, you already voted."

14 "I did? I don't remember voting."

16 "Oh yes, yes. You cast an absentee ballot."

18 "No, I didn't?"

20 "Yes, you did."

- Why does that happen 17,000 times in Pittsburgh?
- 23 People walked in thinking -- actually 15,000 to be
- 24 precise -- why did it happen 15,000 times that people
- 25 in Pittsburgh walked in to vote and they had already

- 1 voted according to the Democrat election machine? Did
- 2 they forget -- that many people with bad memories in
- 3 Pittsburgh? Or is the following correct, that as
- 4 witnesses will testify, they were instructed by the
- 5 Democrat bosses, when they had a ballot in which there
- 6 was no one registered, just assign it to somebody.
- 7 Just assign it to Rudy Giuliani, so when Rudy
- 8 Giuliani -- maybe Rudy Giuliani won't show up to vote.
- 9 And if he does show up to vote, we'll give him a
- 10 provisional ballot.
- 11 That is what we call circumstantial evidence of
- 12 the fraud. The direct evidence of the fraud are people
- 13 who testified that, in fact, that's what happened to
- 14 them, as well as 50 to 60 witnesses we have for the way
- 15 they were treated and not allowed to inspect the
- 16 ballots. They aren't just not allowed to do it, they
- 17 were pushed. In a few cases they were assaulted. In
- 18 all cases they were put in a corral, so far away,
- 19 probably the closest they got is from here to the back
- 20 of that room. We could do like a -- did you all watch
- 21 My Cousin Vinny? It's one of my favorite law movies,
- 22 because he comes from Brooklyn. And when the nice lady
- 23 said she saw, and then he says to her, "How many
- 24 fingers have I got up?" And she says, "Three." Well,
- 25 she was too far away to see it was only two. These

- 1 people were further away than My Cousin Vinny was from
- 2 the witness. They couldn't see a thing.
- Now, I don't know, are you going to tell me that
- 4 sixty people are lying? They didn't just tell me this.
- 5 They swore under penalty of perjury, which is something
- 6 no Democrat's ever done. You don't even ask Biden
- 7 about this. You don't put him under penalty of
- 8 perjury. He doesn't even get asked questions about it
- 9 He doesn't get asked questions about all the evidence
- 10 of the crimes that he committed. These people are
- 11 under penalty of perjury. Their names are on an
- 12 affidavit. They swear that they weren't allowed to
- 13 carry out their function as expected.
- 14 And it's not just a technical thing -- there's a
- 15 reason they did it. Why would you not allow people to
- 16 carry out the function they've been allowed to do for
- 17 50 years, 60 years? Why wouldn't you allow inspections
- 18 of those ballots? Because you knew you were going to
- 19 use those ballots to catch Biden up, and you had a big
- 20 road ahead of you. You had to catch him up for 700,000
- 21 to 800,000 votes that he was behind, and the only way
- 22 you were going to do it is with the mail-in ballots.
- 23 You couldn't have a Democrat and Republican inspector
- 24 around. They don't even have Democrats watching them,

- 1 because they'd be afraid that they'd be honest
- 2 Democrats who would say "You're cheating."
- 3 So that takes us to Michigan, where there was an
- 4 honest Democrat who said they were cheating. Let me
- 5 show you her affidavit, because I know you keep
- 6 reporting falsely that we have no evidence, that we
- 7 have no specific acts of fraud. That's because the
- 8 coverage of this has been almost as dishonest as the
- 9 scheme itself. The people are entitled to know this.
- 10 You don't have the right to keep it from them. You
- 11 don't have a right to lie to about it. They are. You
- 12 don't report to them that a citizen of this country,
- 13 very fine woman, who is willing to allow me to give you
- 14 her name -- I can't give you all these affidavits
- 15 because if I do these people will be harassed, they'll
- 16 be threatened, they may lose their job, they will lose
- 17 their friends. We've lost lawyers in this case because
- 18 they've been threatened. We've had lawyers that need
- 19 protection. What's going in this country is horrible,
- 20 and the censorship that you're imposing is making it
- 21 worse.
- 22 But Jessie Jacob is an adult citizen of the state
- 23 of Michigan. She's been an employee of the city of
- 24 Detroit for Decades. I know her age, but she can tell
- 25 you her age. She was assigned to voting duties in

- 1 September, and she was trained by the city of Detroit
- 2 in the State of Michigan. She was basically trained to
- 3 cheat. She says, I was instructed by my supervisor to
- 4 adjust the mailing date of these absentee ballot
- 5 packages to be dated earlier than when they were
- 6 actually sent in. The supervisor made that
- 7 announcement for all workers to engage in that
- 8 fraudulent practice.
- 9 That's not me saying that, that's this American
- 10 citizen saying that, under oath. I don't know, maybe
- 11 you could say she's lying, but you can't say there's no
- 12 evidence. This is what we call evidence. This is
- 13 direct evidence, not circumstantial. I've tried many,
- 14 many cases as have my colleagues here. You put a
- 15 witness on a witness stand, the witness is testifying
- 16 to their own knowledge. This witness goes on the
- 17 witness stand and she will say, "I was told to adjust
- 18 the date on the absentee ballots. I witnessed election
- 19 workers and employees going over to the voting booths
- 20 with voters in order to watch them vote and coach them
- 21 for whom to vote." Completely. She will testify to
- 22 that. I don't know. Biden's people can cross-examine
- 23 her, but you can't just throw it away. "Gee, there's
- 24 no evidence." Next time you say that you'll be lying
- 25 because there is evidence.

- 1 By the way, this is public. You can all get it.
- 2 Its attached to the complaint in Constantino v. The
- 3 City of Detroit. Then, she was instructed by a
- 4 supervisor not to ask for a driver's license or any
- 5 photo ID when a person was trying to vote. Don't ask
- 6 for an identification. Why would you not ask for
- 7 identification? Because you knew that a lot of people
- 8 not entitled to vote are going to come in and early
- 9 vote -- because you knew that illegal immigrants were
- 10 going to be allowed to vote. You knew if you lived in
- 11 Philadelphia, unless you're stunad, that's an Italian
- 12 expression for stupid, unless you were stupid, you knew
- 13 that a lot of people were coming over from Camden to
- 14 vote. They do every year -- happens all the time in
- 15 Philly. It's about as frequent as getting beaten up at
- 16 a Philadelphia Eagle football game. Happens all the
- 17 time -- all the time. And it is allowed to happen
- 18 because it is a Democrat, corrupt city and has been for
- 19 years, many, many years.
- 20 And they are carried it out in places they could
- 21 get away with it. They didn't carry it out in neutral
- 22 places. They didn't carry it out in Republican places.
- 23 They didn't carry it out where the law is respected.
- 24 They carried it out in a corrupt city where the

- 1 District Attorney releases criminals en masse, which is
- 2 why it has so much crime.
- 3 She also said, "I observed a large number of
- 4 people who came to the satellite location to vote in
- 5 person, but they had already applied for and submitted
- 6 an absentee ballot." So, she observed a lot people
- 7 voting twice. Again, this is Jessie Jacob, not me. I
- 8 was instructed not to invalidate any ballots and not to
- 9 look for any deficiency in the ballots. Why would you
- 10 do that? Because you're cheating -- on
- 11 purpose -- cheating. Intentionally cheating. You're
- 12 cheating as an institution. This is an instruction
- 13 from the Election Commission, or the employer to the
- 14 worker. Don't look for any deficiencies in the
- 15 ballots. "I was instructed not to look at any of the
- 16 of the signatures on the absentee ballots." If she was
- 17 instructed not to look for any of the signatures on the
- 18 absentee ballots, why the heck do you sign it in the
- 19 first place? In order to identify it. She was
- 20 instructed not to do that because many of the absentee
- 21 ballots were fraudulent and they knew that. And they
- 22 didn't want to have a count of that.
- "On November 4, 2020, I was instructed to
- 24 improperly pre-date the absentee ballots when the
- 25 receipt date was actually was after November 3rd,

- 1 2020." Now this is really significant because Justice
- 2 Alito of the Supreme Court instructed Pennsylvania that
- 3 any ballot that comes in after 8:00 o'clock on
- 4 November 3rd 2020, had to be put aside and not only
- 5 because it's a question as to its legality and its
- 6 constitutionality. What she's telling you is that they
- 7 blatantly disregarded that order, that they took
- 8 ballots that were marked the 4th and the 5th and the
- 9 6th, and they marked it down for the 3rd in blatant
- 10 disregard of the order of the United States Supreme
- 11 Court.
- 12 This is -- I don't know if she's a Democrat or a
- 13 Republicans, I assume if she's working for the City of
- 14 Detroit that she's a Democrat. I assume, but I may be
- 15 wrong. She's a citizen. I have never met her -- never
- 16 coached her. And I'd like you to know that it's signed
- 17 under penalty of perjury. We have a hundred more of
- 18 these. I can't show them to you because those people
- 19 don't want to be harassed. They don't want to have
- 20 their lives torn apart by the goons on the other side.
- 21 We don't do that to them. They've done that to a lot
- 22 of our people. They've done it for four years. And
- 23 it's outrageous that it's tolerated. And it's
- 24 tolerated because you condone it in the press. You
- 25 don't cover it. You don't condemn it. And it

- 1 shouldn't happen to a Republican, or a Democrat. A
- 2 lawyer shouldn't have to withdraw from a case because
- 3 he's representing the President of the United States.
- 4 There are many more affidavits here. I'd like to
- 5 read them all to you, but I don't have the time. You
- 6 should have had the time and energy to go look for
- 7 them. That's your job like it's my job to defend the
- 8 President. And I represent the President. It's your
- 9 job to the read these things and not falsely report
- 10 that there's no evidence. Do you know how many
- 11 affidavits we have in the Michigan case -- 220
- 12 affidavits. They're not all public, but eight of them
- 13 are. Four affiants here -- those are people who give
- 14 affidavits -- who report an incident that under any
- 15 other circumstances would have been on the front page
- 16 of all of your newspapers if it didn't involve the
- 17 hatred that you have -- the irrational, pathological
- 18 hatred that you have for the President.
- 19 What they swear to is that at 4:30 in the morning
- 20 a truck pulled up to the Detroit center where they were
- 21 counting ballots. People thought it was food, so they
- 22 all ran to the truck. It wasn't food. It was
- 23 thousands and thousands of ballots. And the ballots
- 24 were in garbage cans. They were in paper bags. They
- 25 were in cardboard boxes, and they were taken into the

- 1 center. They put out a number of tables. At that
- 2 time, they thought all the Republican inspectors had
- 3 left. All but two had. And an employee of Dominion,
- 4 who we will address a little bit later -- Dominion.
- 5 And here's what they jointly swear to: That every
- 6 ballot that they could see everything they could
- 7 hear -- these were ballots for Biden. When they saw a
- 8 ballot, these were ballots only for Biden, meaning
- 9 there was no down ticket, just Biden. Many of them
- 10 didn't have anything on the outer envelope because
- 11 these ballots were produced very quickly, very swiftly,
- 12 and they're estimated to be minimum of 60,000 maximum
- of 100,000. Many of them were triple-counted which
- 14 means they were put into the counting machine this way
- 15 once, twice, three, times.
- 16 I didn't see that. I don't know that but for the
- 17 fact that three American citizens are willing to swear
- 18 to it. And we're not going to let them go to court and
- 19 do that? We're going to let this election go by, and
- 20 when there are, in this case, 60 witnesses that can
- 21 prove what I'm saying to you and other acts of fraud in
- 22 Michigan? And what's happened to this country if we're
- 23 going to let that happen? What's happened to this
- 24 country if we're going to cover that up? We let Al

- 1 Gore carry on an election dispute longer than this one
- 2 has been going on for one state and for chads.
- 3 This happened in Pennsylvania, it happened in
- 4 Michigan. Michigan, probably right now if I count up
- 5 the affidavits, just one case alone, Trump v. Benson, a
- 6 case that we dismissed today because that case was
- 7 attempting to get the Wayne County Board of Supervisors
- 8 to certify. Well, they didn't; they decertified. That
- 9 case has 100 affidavits and the hundred affidavits show
- 10 essentially what I've talked to you about -- counting
- 11 ballots improperly, counting them three or four times,
- 12 having people vote three or four times, changing and
- 13 backdating ballots to the point of at least 300,000
- 14 illegitimate ballots that we can specifically identify.
- 15 The margin in Michigan was is 146,121, and these
- 16 ballots were all cast basically in Detroit that Biden
- 17 won 80/20. So, you see it changes the result of the
- 18 election in Michigan if you take out Wayne County, so
- 19 it's a very significant case. That is being raised in
- 20 the case of Constantino v. The City of Detroit, not by
- 21 us, by an individual plaintiff. We are helping and
- 22 assisting in that case, however. And you can find all
- 23 the affidavits that you want filed in that case. You
- 24 can find out not just allegations; they're allegations
- 25 supported by sworn testimony, which is a lot better

- 1 than Joe Biden has ever done on anything. He doesn't
- 2 answer questions, must mush lest give sworn affidavits.
- 3 Wisconsin: Wisconsin had a very small
- 4 margin -- 20,544 last time I looked. And Wisconsin,
- 5 without going into great detail -- very similar plan
- 6 with the Republicans shut out in the city of Milwaukee
- 7 and also in Madison -- Republicans almost universally
- 8 shut out from the absentee process, not allowed to
- 9 inspect, not allowed to look at the ballots.
- 10 We have in Milwaukee and in the state of
- 11 Wisconsin a much stricter law. Wisconsin doesn't allow
- 12 mail-in ballots. They didn't buy into the big mail-in
- 13 ballot situation. Wisconsin, when you look at their
- 14 constitution, it almost seems to not like absentee
- 15 ballots. They state it's not a right, it's a
- 16 privilege. And they have very, very strict procedures.
- 17 And the strict procedure says that you can't be given
- 18 an absentee ballot, you have to personally apply for
- 19 one. It's illegal, basically, to solicit a vote. And
- 20 they have actually, many reasons for it. It probably
- 21 goes back to their progressive days. When I say
- 22 progressive, I mean late nineteenth century, early
- 23 twentieth century progressive, when that really meant
- 24 progressive, not retrogressive.

- 1 So, there were 60,000 ballots in Milwaukee County,
- 2 and 40,000 ballots in Madison that, as far as we can
- 3 tell, and this is why we've ordered, because we have
- 4 very good information that numbers are going to come
- 5 out about here, that don't have applications. Under
- 6 the law of the State of Wisconsin, which has already
- 7 decided if there's no application for an absentee
- 8 ballot, the absentee ballot is thrown away. This all
- 9 happened in two places in Wisconsin. It didn't happen
- 10 in northern Wisconsin. It didn't happen in Republican
- 11 Wisconsin. It didn't happen in neutral Wisconsin where
- 12 there's an equal number of Republicans and Democrats.
- 13 It happened in a place where the vote was 75-80% for
- 14 the Democrat. You take away any number of those and
- 15 that 20,000 lead disappears. In other words, if you
- 16 count the lawful votes, Trump won Wisconsin by a good
- 17 margin. Indeed, if you count the lawful votes in
- 18 Pennsylvania, he won by about 300,000 votes.
- 19 Also, in the lawsuit filed Wisconsin which is
- 20 really a petition because of their procedures, there
- 21 were no inspectors provided for the counting of illegal
- 22 ballots. There were numerous backdated ballots. We're
- 23 just counting them now, run over into the thousands.
- 24 And there were many precincts in which there was an
- 25 overvote. And let me explain to you what an overvote

- 1 is, which is something you should have explained to the
- 2 American people because it's about the clearest
- 3 circumstantial evidence of massive fraud can you have.
- 4 An overvote is if 200% of the people who are registered
- 5 in the district vote. Think about that: 200% of the
- 6 registered voters in the district vote. What does that
- 7 mean? That means somebody voted twice. That means
- 8 somebody who's not entitled to vote, voted -- an
- 9 illegal, a person from another city or state, a person
- 10 who's not registered. But what it means is that those
- 11 were illegitimate votes. You don't have an overvote of
- 12 200 percent or 300 percent. You don't have an overvote
- 13 of 100%. Most precincts don't have a 100% turnout. In
- 14 fact, classically it's considered to be an overvote if
- 15 you go over 80%. Well, in Michigan and Wisconsin we
- 16 have overvotes in numerous precincts of a 150% or 200%
- 17 and 300%. One of the reasons why the two Republicans
- 18 didn't certify, in Wayne, Michigan -- Wayne County,
- 19 Michigan -- is because the overvote was so high,
- 20 monstrously high, in about two-thirds of the precincts
- 21 in the City of Detroit, which means, magically,
- 22 two-and-three times the number of registered voters
- 23 turned out to vote. In fact, we have precincts in
- 24 which two times of the number of people who live there,
- 25 including children, voted. It's absurd.

- 1 The frustration of this is, what I'm describing to
- 2 you is massive fraud. It isn't a little teeny one.
- 3 It's isn't, you know, a hundred votes switched here or
- 4 there. Georgia -- we're about to file a major lawsuit
- 5 in Georgia. That will be filed, probably tomorrow. I
- 6 don't need to go through it -- virtually the same
- 7 things I told you before. In the City of Atlanta, the
- 8 Republicans were not allowed to watch the absentee
- 9 mail-in ballot process. Inspections were completely
- 10 cast aside. And we have numerous double-voters. We
- 11 have numerous out-of-state voters. And we have
- 12 specific evidence of intimidation and changes of vote.
- 13 That will all be in the lawsuit that comes out
- 14 tomorrow.
- Arizona is a state that we're looking at very,
- 16 very carefully. I would say we're probably going to
- 17 bring a lawsuit in Arizona -- more than probably. I
- 18 think we are going to bring a lawsuit in Arizona; we're
- 19 still collecting that evidence. And the state that
- 20 we're looking at that would surprise you is, we have
- 21 very, very significant amount of fraud allegations in
- 22 the state of New Mexico, which -- and we have a
- 23 significant number of allegations in the state of
- 24 Virginia. We don't know yet whether the number in

- 1 Virginia will reach a number that can turn the
- 2 election.
- 3 The states that we have indicated in -- Georgia
- 4 Pennsylvania, Michigan, Wisconsin, Nevada, and Arizona,
- 5 we have more than double the number of votes needed to
- 6 overturn the election, in terms of provable illegal
- 7 ballots. All you got to do to find out if I'm
- 8 misleading you at all is to look at the lawsuits. Look
- 9 at what's alleged. Look at the affidavits. Maybe we
- 10 can supply more affidavits. In order to do it I need
- 11 to get permission from the people, but in the materials
- 12 I have here there are at least ten that come from
- 13 citizens. We have a thousand, at least. And we're
- 14 getting more every day, and there are other aspects of
- 15 this fraud that at this point I really can't reveal.
- 16 This is really enough. It's enough to overturn any
- 17 election. It's disgrace what happened.
- 18 And I'll conclude by asking you to just think
- 19 about this for a minute: What happened on the morning
- 20 of November 3rd when they were going to count this new
- 21 kind of ballot -- this mail-in ballot? Did every
- 22 Democrat leader in Pennsylvania and in Michigan and in
- 23 Wisconsin and in Georgia and in Nevada and in
- 24 Arizona -- did they all wake up and all separately have
- 25 the same idea? Did they all separately have the idea

- 1 that we are going to put Republican inspectors in
- 2 pens -- we're not going to let them look at mail-in or
- 3 absentee ballots? Did they all independently come up
- 4 with that, just by coincidence? Hey, we're going to
- 5 put the Republicans in pens and corrals -- we're going
- 6 to do it in Pittsburgh; we're going to do it in
- 7 Philadelphia; we're going to do it in Detroit; we're
- 8 going to do it in Milwaukee; we're going to do it in
- 9 Las Vegas; we're going to do it in Phoenix; we're going
- 10 to do it in Atlanta -- or, is it the logical conclusion
- 11 that I think any jury would accept as they heard this
- 12 evidence that somebody had this plan? Maybe that was
- 13 always the plan -- to do this very, very questionable
- 14 form of voting which has been criticized by President
- 15 Carter, by Secretary Baker, by most experts on election
- 16 reform. I think the logical conclusion is this is a
- 17 common plan and a common scheme that comes right
- 18 directly from the Democrat Party and it comes from the
- 19 candidate. Clearly. That's the reason why Hillary
- 20 Clinton said, "Don't concede if even if you're losing."
- 21 That's the reason we had a Freudian slip by the
- 22 candidate when he said he had the best voter fraud team
- 23 in the country. That's the reason why he probably
- 24 didn't have to go out and campaign. He had to have
- 25 known what they were going to do. This had a to be

- 1 planned in advance. I'm kind of checking, did they go,
- 2 you know, to the same contractor to get the corrals to
- 3 put the republicans in.
- 4 This is a disgraceful thing that was done in this
- 5 country, probably not much more disgraceful than the
- 6 things these people did in office, which you didn't and
- 7 don't bother to cover and you conceal from the American
- 8 people. But we let this happen. You know, we use
- 9 largely the Venezuelan voting machine, in essence, to
- 10 count our vote. We let this happen, we're going to be
- 11 become Venezuela. We cannot let this happen to us. We
- 12 cannot allow these crooks, because that's what they
- 13 are, to steal an election from the American people.
- 14 They elected Donald Trump. They didn't elect Joe
- 15 Biden. Joe Biden is in the lead because of the
- 16 fraudulent ballots, the illegal ballots, that were
- 17 produced and that were allowed to be used after the
- 18 election was over. Give us an opportunity to prove it
- 19 in court and we will.
- Now I'm going to ask. Sidney Powell to describe
- 21 to you what we can describe about another totally
- 22 outrageous situation. I don't think most Americans
- 23 know that our ballots get calculated -- many of
- 24 them -- outside of the United States and are completely
- 25 open to hacking -- completely open to change -- and

- 1 it's being done by a company that specializes in voter
- 2 fraud. I'll let Sidney describe that to you.

- 4 SIDNEY POWELL: Thank you, Rudy. What we are really
- 5 dealing with here and uncovering more by the day is the
- 6 massive influence of communist money through Venezuela,
- 7 Cuba, and likely China in the interference with our
- 8 elections here in the United States. The Dominion
- 9 voting systems, the Smartmatic technology software and
- 10 the software that goes in other computerized voting
- 11 systems here as well, not just Dominion, were created
- 12 in Venezuela, at the direction of Hugo Chavez, to make
- 13 sure he never lost an election after one constitutional
- 14 referendum came out the way he did not want to come
- 15 out.
- 16 We have one very strong witness who has explained
- 17 how it all works. His affidavit is attached to the
- 18 pleadings of Lin Wood in the lawsuit he filed in
- 19 Georgia. It is a stunning, detailed affidavit because
- 20 he was with Hugo Chavez while he was being briefed on
- 21 how it works. He was with Hugo Chavez when he saw it
- 22 operate to make sure the election came out his way,
- 23 that was the express purpose for creating this
- 24 software. He has seen it operate, and as soon as he
- 25 saw the multiple states shut down the voting at on the

- 1 night of the election, he knew the same thing was
- 2 happening here, that was what had gone on.
- 3 Now the software itself was created with so many
- 4 variables and so many back doors that can be hooked up
- 5 to the internet, or thumb drive stuck in it, or
- 6 whatever, but one of its most characteristic features
- 7 is its ability to flip votes. It can set and run an
- 8 algorithm that probably ran all over the country to
- 9 take a certain percentage of votes from President Trump
- 10 and flip them to President Biden, which we might never
- 11 have uncovered had the votes for President Trump have
- 12 been so overwhelming in so many of these states, that
- 13 it broke the algorithm that had been plugged into the
- 14 system, and that's what caused them to have to shut
- 15 down in the states they shut down in. That's when they
- 16 came in the back door with all the mail-in ballots,
- 17 many of which they'd actually fabricated. Some were on
- 18 pristine paper with identically matching, perfect
- 19 circle dots for Mr. Biden. Others were shoved in in
- 20 batches -- they're always put in in a certain number of
- 21 batches, and people would rerun the same batch. This
- 22 corresponds to our statistical evidence that shows
- 23 incredible spikes in the vote counts at particular
- 24 times and that corresponds to eyewitness testimony of

- 1 numerous people who have come forward and said they saw
- 2 the ballots come in the back door at that time.
- Notably, the Dominion executives are nowhere to be
- 4 found, now. They're moving their offices overnight to
- 5 different places. Their office in Toronto was shared
- 6 with one of the Soros Entities. One of the leaders of
- 7 the Dominion project overall is Gordon Malloch-Brown,
- 8 Mr. Soros' number-two person in the UK and part of his
- 9 organization. There are ties of the Dominion
- 10 Leadership to the Clinton Foundation and to other known
- 11 politicians in this country. Just to give you a brief
- 12 description of how this worked, I'm going to quote from
- 13 a letter that was written, and I will read that to make
- 14 sure I get the quotes right. This person was objecting
- 15 to the United States acquisition of is he Sequoia
- 16 Voting Systems by Smartmatic, a foreign owned company:

- 18 "I believe this transaction raises exactly the
- 19 sort of foreign ownership issues that Cepheus is
- 20 best positioned to examine for national security
- 21 purposes. It's undisputed that Smartmatic is
- foreign-owned and that it has acquired Sequoia."

- 24 They keep changing the names as they go along.
- 25 Different times, when a problem comes up you can just

- 1 create a different corporation and call it a different
- 2 name, but it was a voting machine company doing busines
- 3 in the United States.
- 4 "Sequoia voting machines were used to record over
- 5 125,000,000 votes during the 2004 Presidential
- 6 election in the United States. Smartmatic, now
- 7 acknowledges that Antonio Mugica, a Venezuelan
- businessman, has controlling interest in
- 9 Smartmatic, but the company has not revealed who
- 10 all the Smartmatic owners are. According to the
- 11 press, Smartmatic's owners are hidden through a
- web of offshore private entities, and that is, in
- 13 fact true. Smartmatic has been associated with
- the Venezuelan government led by Hugo Chavez,
- which is openly hostile to the United States."
- 16 and of course as we all know communistic and really
- 17 brutalizing its own people.
- 18 "The system has been continued there by
- 19 Mr. Maduro; it insured his election. Smartmatic's
- 20 possible connection to the Venezuelan government
- 21 posits a potential national security concern in
- the context of its acquisition of Sequoia because
- 23 electronic voting machines are susceptible to
- tampering and insiders are in the best position to

- 1 engage in such tampering. This letter expresses
- the concern of the Chicago 2006 primary election.
- 3 And it ends by saying,
- 4 "The products and services that are of Venezuelan
- origin and evaluates Smartmatic's ownership to
- 6 determine who could have influence and control
- 7 over these and other Sequoia products and services
- 8 are important to the national security of the
- 9 United States."
- 10 This letter was written to Hank Paulson on
- 11 October 6, 2006 by Congresswoman Carolyn B. Maloney.
- 12 Senators Klobuchar and Warren have raised these
- 13 concerns as recently as December 2019. Why our
- 14 government has not taken them seriously is beyond my
- 15 comprehension unless some of the three-letter agencies
- 16 have used them themselves in other parts of the world.
- 17 We know that the technology was exported to affect an
- 18 election in Argentina. That's admitted by our friend
- 19 who wrote the affidavit about Hugo Chavez and his
- 20 interest in Smartmatic. Again, in 2006, Carolyn
- 21 Maloney wrote the Honorable John Snow, the Secretary of
- 22 the Treasury about the issues.
- 23 Speaking of Smartmatic's leadership, one of
- 24 Smartmatic's patent holders -- Eric Coomer, I believe
- 25 his name is -- is on the web as being recorded in a

- 1 conversation with Antifa members saying that he had the
- 2 election rigged for Mr. Biden, nothing to worry about
- 3 here. And he was going to -- they were going to
- 4 "F- Trump." His social media is filled with hatred for
- 5 the President and For the United States of America as a
- 6 whole, as are the social media accounts of many other
- 7 Smartmatic people.
- 8 There has been widespread use of this. Dominion
- 9 itself is utilized in 2,000 jurisdictions in 30 states.
- 10 It has been uncertifiable in multiple states who
- 11 realized all of the problems that it has including
- 12 Texas. Experts have described it across the board from
- 13 a Princeton group of three professors to experts that
- 14 we've talked to about its end user vulnerabilities.
- 15 People can admittedly go in and change whatever they
- 16 want. They can set the ratio of votes from one thing
- 17 to another. They can say that a Biden vote counts as
- 18 1.25 and a Trump vote counts .75, and those may be the
- 19 numbers that were actually used here.
- It's not just the swing states that were affected.
- 21 The algorithm was likely run across the country to
- 22 affect the entire election. Like I said, we only
- 23 discovered it this year because of the overwhelming
- 24 number of votes for President Trump in the swing states
- 25 that caused machines to have to shut down for them to

- 1 backfill for adding votes. We have evidence of
- 2 different numbers of votes being injected into the
- 3 system, the same, identical, unique six-digit number
- 4 multiple times in at least two states that we've
- 5 analyzed so far, and I'm talking about 341,542 votes
- 6 for Biden and 100,012 for Trump. There's no
- 7 explanation, no logical explanation for the same
- 8 numbers being injected 20 minutes apart into the
- 9 machine.
- 10 The software manual itself, you can download it
- 11 from the internet, and I would encourage you all to
- 12 read it because it specifically advertises some of
- 13 these things as features of system. Why it was ever
- 14 allowed into this country is beyond my comprehension
- 15 and why nobody has dealt with it as absolutely
- 16 appalling. The machines were easily accessible to
- 17 hackers. There's video on the net that will explain to
- 18 you how a kid with a cell phone can hack one of these
- 19 voting machines.
- 20 There's been no oversight of Dominion or its
- 21 software. Workers in each county were trained by
- 22 Dominion, but there's no evidence of any monitoring
- 23 otherwise. We have testimony of different workers
- 24 admitting that they were trained how to dispose of
- 25 Trump votes and add Biden votes. The software has a

- 1 feature pursuant to which you can drag and drop any
- 2 number of batches of votes to the candidate of your
- 3 choice or simply throw them away, so we have
- 4 mathematical evidence in a number of states of massive
- 5 quantities of Trump votes being trashed -- just simply
- 6 put in the trash like you would in your computer with
- 7 any file, and Biden votes being injected. That's in
- 8 addition to the flipping.
- 9 I mean, it really happens in two ways. There's an
- 10 algorithm that runs that automatically flips all of the
- 11 votes and then each operator has the ability to go in,
- 12 override settings, they can ignore signature, they can
- 13 ignore the top line of the ballot, they can go down
- 14 ballot and select who they want to change the results
- 15 for, The gentleman who founded Smartmatic, there's
- 16 video of him on the internet explaining that, yes, on
- 17 at least one occasion he admits they changed a million
- 18 votes with no problem.
- 19 Many of the jurisdictions that have had this
- 20 problem might not have known of the issues, but many
- 21 did. And I think a full-scale criminal investigation
- 22 needs to be undertaken immediately by the Department of
- 23 Justice and by every State's equivalent Attorney
- 24 General's office or state investigatory unit because
- 25 there's evidence of different benefits being provided

- 1 to the people who spent \$100,000,000 of money at the
- 2 last minute for their state to get the Dominion voting
- 3 systems put in in time for election in different ways.
- 4 There's one person that a lawyer told me got election
- 5 insurance, meaning that he would be able to make sure
- 6 he was elected. I'm sure they explained that feature
- 7 in detail to many people who expressed interest in
- 8 putting this voting system in.
- 9 Texas denied certification of the Dominion system
- 10 in 2019, but there are, no doubt, issues with the
- 11 software that Texas did use unbeknownst to Texas, I
- 12 would imagine, since they went to great trouble to
- 13 examine the Dominion systems and reject them, but other
- 14 software in the source code that does the alterations
- 15 is embedded, we've been told, in the source code all
- 16 across the country in all the voting machines. There's
- 17 no doubt it has been used to alter elections in other
- 18 countries. We know specifically that Venezuela
- 19 exported it for that purpose to Argentina and other
- 20 Latin American countries to make sure that the corrupt
- 21 rulers who were willing to pay the highest price for
- 22 being in office were allowed to rig their elections.
- This is stunning, heart-breaking, infuriating, and
- 24 the most unpatriotic acts I can even imagine for people
- 25 in this country to have participated in, in any way,

- 1 shape, or form, and I want the American public to know
- 2 right now that we will not be intimidated. American
- 3 patriots are fed up with the corruption from the local
- 4 level to the highest level of our government, and we
- 5 are going to take this country back. We're not going
- 6 to be intimidated. We're not going to back down. We
- 7 are going to clean this mess up now. President Trump
- 8 won by a landslide. We're going to prove it, and we're
- 9 going to reclaim the United States of America for the
- 10 people who vote for freedom.

- 12 **JENNA ELLIS:** My name is Jenna Ellis and I'm a senior
- 13 legal advisor to the Trump campaign and I'd like to
- 14 just explain now where we've been and where we're at,
- 15 and what you can expect from this process.
- So, what you have heard, I'm sure, in the fake
- 17 newspapers tomorrow will be one of two things, either
- 18 there was not sufficient evidence that we've presented,
- 19 or we spoke too long. Okay, so what you've heard now is
- 20 basically an opening statement. This is what you can
- 21 expect to see when we get to court to actually have a
- 22 full trial on the merits, to actually show this
- 23 evidence in court and prove our case. This is not a
- 24 Law and Order episode where everything is neatly
- 25 wrapped up in 60 minutes.

- 1 For those of you who are here in this room or have
- 2 maybe tuned out in other networks, clearly, you've
- 3 never been court reporters. Trials take time. Putting
- 4 on evidence takes time. This is basically an opening
- 5 statement so the American people can understand what
- 6 the networks have been hiding and what they refuse to
- 7 cover, because all of your fake news headlines are
- 8 dancing around the merits of this case and are trying
- 9 to delegitimize what we're doing here.
- 10 Let me be very clear that our objective is to make
- 11 sure to preserve and protect election integrity.
- 12 President Trump has been saying from day one that this
- 13 is about maintaining free and fair elections in this
- 14 country. It is not about overturning an outcome. It
- 15 is about making sure that election integrity is
- 16 preserved, and every American should want that. If
- 17 every American is not onboard with that you have to ask
- 18 yourself why. And if your fake news network is not
- 19 covering this, or allowing you cover it fairly and
- 20 accurately, you should ask yourself why. It is
- 21 absolutely a legitimate legal basis.
- We have been asked to provide an entire case that
- 23 generally would take years in civil litigation. I've
- 24 been a prosecutor. I have tried cases with far simpler

- 1 facts. One thing happened in a matter of minutes and
- 2 it still takes days. And we go through a jury process.
- 3 This is the court of public opinion right now. We
- 4 are not trying our case in the court of public opinion,
- 5 because if we were, we would get unbiased jurors. I
- 6 would strike 99% of you from the jury and I would be
- 7 allowed to because of the fake news coverage you
- 8 provide. You're not unbiased jurors and until you step
- 9 out of your role as a journalist and actually go into a
- 10 courtroom and you are a judge on a bench that has sworn
- 11 an oath to be unbiased in our separation of powers,
- 12 then your opinion does not matter. The facts matter;
- 13 the truth matters, and if you are fair reporters, you
- 14 will cover that fairly and appropriately and you will
- 15 allow coverage of our media team and our legal team.
- 16 That is absolutely shocking that all you cover are
- 17 around the margins. And I've seen all of you taking
- 18 pictures right now, and I anticipate what your
- 19 headlines are going to be. If you are not willing to
- 20 talk about the evidence that has been presented, then
- 21 that is absolutely unacceptable for journalistic
- 22 standards. This is an opening statement. This is
- 23 something where we have told you what the evidence will
- 24 show. And we have given you a brief description. That
- 25 happens in a courtroom all the time where that's not

- 1 the fact-finding process, that is just an overview.
- 2 That is what we have given you today because the
- 3 American people deserve to know what we have uncovered
- 4 in the last couple of weeks.
- 5 Remember, this is such a short time frame, and
- 6 this is an elite strike force team that is working on
- 7 behalf of the President and the campaign to make sure
- 8 that our constitution is protected. We are a nation of
- 9 rules, not a nation of rulers. There is not someone
- 10 that just gets to pick who the next President is
- 11 outside of the will of the American people.
- 12 And that is our task, because when we talk about
- 13 voter fraud, it's actually election official fraud.
- 14 That cannot stand. The constitution requires that the
- 15 state legislatures are the ones that make election law.
- 16 It still has to go by the US Constitution, but what has
- 17 happened in this case is that state and local level
- 18 officials and all the way up, have changed the rules.
- 19 That's what the Democrats do if they don't like the
- 20 rules -- they change them, and they change them at the
- 21 last minute. They manipulate them, they want to tear
- 22 down our American system.
- Our founders were so brilliant that they
- 24 anticipated this, that there would be corruption, there
- 25 would be foreign influence, there would be attempts to

- 1 manipulate the outcome of the election, especially with
- 2 who they called our Chief Magistrate. I would encourage
- 3 you to go home and actually read Alexander Hamilton
- 4 Federalist 68 and see what he described as an advocacy
- 5 position to adopt and ratify the electoral college and
- 6 the process by which we select our President. We
- 7 select our President through the electoral college not
- 8 because it disenfranchises voters but because it is a
- 9 security mechanism for exactly the type of corruption
- 10 that we're uncovering. And every American should be
- 11 grateful and thankful that our founders had the
- 12 foresight to put in those protections and provisions to
- 13 make sure that your legitimate, legal vote is not
- 14 disenfranchised. That is what we're advocating for.
- We want to make sure to protect election integrity
- 16 and your president -- President Trump -- we are so
- 17 proud that he is in this fight, because he understands
- 18 that when he swore his oath of office, he swore an oath
- 19 to uphold and defend the United States Constitution.
- 20 That is what he is doing and that is what we are doing.
- 21 We're confident that through this multiple pathways to
- 22 victory, we will get to the actual outcome that the
- 23 evidence shows. But this is not about overturning an
- 24 election on our part, it's about making sure that we

- 1 protect and preserve free and fair elections for all
- 2 future American elections.
- 3 If the United States caves to corruption or this
- 4 type of election integrity disaster, then no election
- 5 will be secure from here on out, and we all need to be
- 6 keenly aware of that. We are the representatives here
- 7 that are standing in this gap and defending President
- 8 Trump and defending you, the American people at the end
- 9 of the day. This is ultimately about the United States
- 10 of America and we want to make sure to protect and
- 11 defend that, and as my colleagues have said, we will
- 12 not back down. We won't be intimidated. President Trump
- 13 will not be intimidated. You, the American people
- 14 should not be intimidated.
- 15 You, the press, should cover this fairly and
- 16 should know that this matters to election integrity and
- 17 it matters to the future of our nation. So, we've
- 18 given you an overview, but recognize this is not a
- 19 court of law. We will get there, and we have time, and
- 20 we have constitutional provisions that will step in
- 21 when we show the corruption and the irredeemably
- 22 challenged and overturned votes that are absolutely
- 23 corrupt in all of these counties. It is irredeemably
- 24 compromised. We will show that, but you have to give
- 25 us that opportunity. This has been just our opening

- 1 statement, and we have an opportunity to get there, and
- 2 we have time, and we will do that. This is the United
- 3 States of America and we stand proudly for President
- 4 Donald J. Trump. Thank you.

- 6 SIDNEY POWELL: The world is watching this. I have
- 7 gotten multiple emails from people in other countries
- 8 who watched the same pattern happen there. We have
- 9 witness testimony that the same things were done in
- 10 those countries as this was exported from Venezuela and
- 11 by Maduro and by Mr. Chavez and by Cuba, and of course
- 12 we know China also has a substantial presence in
- 13 Venezuela and substantial interest in making sure that
- 14 President Trump does not continue in office.
- 15 This is the consummate foreign interference in our
- 16 election, in the most criminal way you possibly
- 17 imagine. It must be shut down. We know, for example,
- 18 that one of the Dominion's highest level employees, or
- 19 officers, went to Detroit himself to man the Detroit
- 20 operation center where he could watch the votes coming
- 21 in real time and decide what file folder in the system
- 22 to put those votes into. That's why you see massive
- 23 spikes after hours when people were told that all the
- 24 votes were in and all the votes were counted.

- 1 Many Dominion employees have already reached out
- 2 to us to tell us the truth. They are Americans who
- 3 want to ensure election integrity like we do. I would
- 4 encourage every Dominion or Smartmatic employee who is
- 5 fed up with the corruption in this country to come
- 6 forward as soon as possible because these are serious
- 7 federal offenses that I'm confident the Department of
- 8 Justice will be in pursuit of in very short order if
- 9 they are not already.
